Al was a strong believer in empowerment and accountability when it came to how you approached your work.

In our time together at Whitemouth Detachment, he took the time and interest in coaching me in how to investigate everything and also how to write reports. Many times a typed report would be corrected and retyped until it was done correctly. He told me early on that he would teach me everything he knew from how to investigate to write a report to where to buy a cheap suit in Winnipeg. He did just that. On one occasion, he took me to Winnipeg and introduced me to two Winnipeg City Police detectives he knew, so that I could successfully complete an investigation. He really wanted me to succeed.
