Alyce Ann Andison (McLeod) Mom passed away peacefully on Friday, December 3, 2010 with her sons by her side. Born April 24, 1923 in Happy Valley, Metchosin near Victoria, Alyce attended Victoria High School and served in the army during World War II (CWAC). After the war she worked for the Federal Department of Agriculture in Victoria which is where she met and married husband Harry in 1950.
